- 2. What does verse 4:13 teach?
  - a. Christians and non-Christians grieve in the same way after someone dies.

- 3. When Christ comes again, who will be with him first, those who have already died or those who are still alive? (verses 4:14-16)
- 4. When Christ comes again, will it be quiet and secret or noisy and public? (verse 4:16)
- 5. Christians who are alive at that time will go up to \_\_\_\_\_\_ the Lord on his return to earth (verse 4:17).
- 6. Is it possible to predict when Jesus will return? (verses 5:1-2)
- 7. If Christ comes like a thief in the night, should Christians be afraid? (verses 5:3-5)

  - b. No, because we do not live in the darkness or the night.
  - c. No, because we know he is not coming back soon.
- 8. If we are not people of the night or the darkness but of the day and the light, how should we live? (verses 5:6-8)

  - b. We should live in the light, being alert, attentive, self-controlled, prepared, practicing faith, love, and hope.
  - c. We can practice the deeds of darkness even though we are of the light.
